*Providing for the Future:  
Theory and Practice in the Eighteenth Century*

The 2011 Seminar for Junior Scholars is being organized within the framework of the 13<sup>th</sup> International Congress for Eighteenth Century Studies in Graz (Austria) (25<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup> of July). For that reason, the theme of the seminar has been integrated with the main topic of the congress (*Time in the Age of Enlightenment: Situating the Present, Imagining the Future*): *Providing*. This topic encompasses eighteenth century perspectives on the future as well as the organisational measures undertaken in the eighteenth century in order to provide for the future. Examples of research areas that might be relevant to this topic of *providing* include medicine, education, intelligence services, economic strategy and ecology.

The seminar languages are English and French.

The number of participants is limited to 15 and applicants should be either doctoral candidates or young postdocs.

Applications are open from September 1<sup>st</sup> 2010 until January the 31<sup>st</sup> 2011.

All applications should include:

1. A completed application form (The form will be available on the congress website [www.18thcenturycongress-graz2011.at](http://www.18thcenturycongress-graz2011.at) from September 15<sup>th</sup> 2010),
2. A one page abstract (one-and-a-half spaced, 12pt),
3. The applicant's curriculum vitae,
4. A letter of recommendation from an academic senior scholar.

The Congress Committee will assess the applications. Successful candidates will be notified in February 2011.

Seminar participants will be registered by the Congress office and receive a bursary of 650 Euros for costs incurred during the congress (Accommodation, Food, Congress fee). Travel costs, however, will not be paid.

The Congress Committee
